Highlights for 2009

User fees with Residential Tag is \$96/year. This fee will be prorated quarterly. If you purchase your tag between:

January 1– March 31- \$96

April 1– June 30- \$72.00

July 1– September 30- \$48.00

October 1– December 31- \$24.00

User fees for Landfill tags are \$35/ton, except for contaminated soil at \$18/ton and sewage sludge at \$30/ton.

Construction debris is acceptable only at the Allegany County Landfill and will be charged the current Landfill user fee of \$35/ton. The only C&D acceptable at the transfer station by residential tag holders is incidental amounts that can be put into one bag or trash pail per day, up to 55-gallon per day.

Residential tags are accepted at the Allegany County Transfer Stations and the County Landfills. They are only for waste from the house in which you live in Allegany County.

No more than 3-cubic yards of waste or an amount equal to one full size pickup loaded no higher than the top of the original sides will be accepted per day at the transfer stations.

If a residential tag holder wishes to dispose of more than 3-cubic yards in one day, he will have to use the Landfill and pay the user fee of \$35/ton for the entire load or loads.

Lost tags have a replacement fee of \$25.00.

The tag must be hung on rear-view mirror.

Used Tire Disposal

Tires can be disposed on at the Allegany County Landfill only and the fees are as follows:

Up to 20 inch- \$1.50 per tire

19.5 inch to 24.5 inch- \$9.00 per tire

Larger than 24.5 inch- \$140 per ton

Tires up to 24.5 inch in loads of 20 or more- \$140 per ton

Tires must be removed from rims.

If free tire days are approved for 2009, schedules will appear in local newspapers.

Proper disposal of medical syringes at home can prevent injury, illness, and pollution. Allegany County DPW's Safe Syringe Disposal Program makes syringe disposal easy and safe. Residents can receive FREE individual sharps containers at any county pharmacy or any county solid waste facility. Household sharps should be properly disposed of at one of the 5

different drop boxes located throughout the county. Residents can also bring sharps in approved containers to all transfer stations (give to operator). All the free sharps containers include an attached label with the disposal locations and a brochure describing safe handling of used needles. The Allegany County Safe Sharps Collection Program greatly increases the awareness of proper sharps disposal and greatly decreases the exposure of injury to our solid waste

employees and provides the public with a simplified and easily accessible disposal system for their home generated sharps. Questions should be directed to Allegany County Recycling Coordinator @ 585-268-7282.



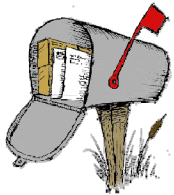

Frequently Asked Questions

Lead Acid (Vehicle) Batteries:

Accepted at any transfer station and County landfill; place in designated area.

Hard Cover Books: Do not discard; special box for recycling at Landfill only.

White Goods: (Large appliances) accepted at County Landfill only, no charge.

Fluorescent Bulbs: Do not discard; save for household hazardous waste day.

Telephone Books: Can be recycled with newspapers. Paperback books can be recycled with newspapers.

Vegetable Oil: We do not accept. Call Darling International @ 800-729-0655

Scrap Metal: Accepted at any Transfer Station and County Landfill; place in designated area.

Household Batteries: Do not discard— save for household hazardous day.

Box Spring/Mattresses: accepted at transfer stations.

Propane Cylinders— 20 lbs or larger give to Transfer Station Operator

Computers & Electronics Recycling

A recycling container is available at the county landfill and each transfer station for computers and electronic items such as fax machines, copiers, telephones, cell phones, printers, keyboards, stereo equipment, VCR's, DVD players and any PDS item. The materials are recycled and sent to a certified electronics dismantler in New York State.

Household Hazardous Waste Day Scheduled for September

The Allegany County Department of Public Works is announcing their 11th annual Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day to be held September 12, 2009. The collection will be held from 8:00 a.m. to 12 noon at the County Landfill in Belmont. Some of the items accepted include oil based paints, insecticides, poisons, pesticides, solvents, and pool



chemicals. Pre-registration is required and only Allegany County residents can participate. Some items such as ammunition, explosives and medical waste are excluded. Common household products with warning labels that read danger, poison, and caution are considered potentially hazardous and should not be casually thrown into the garbage. Incidental

amounts of chemicals in products could become concentrated in the landfill causing fires such as toxic fumes, flash fires or chemical burns and as a consequence the County Landfill does not accept hazardous waste.

Paper & Cardboard		Plastic Containers	
What's Recyclable	What's NOT!	What's Recyclable	What's NOT!
<p>Cardboard boxes: cereal boxes, shoeboxes, corrugated cardboard, etc. Including brown paper bags.</p> <p>Mixed papers: newspapers, magazines, lined paper, computer paper, copy paper, junk mail, envelopes, etc.</p>	<p>Padded mailing envelopes, manila folders, powder detergent boxes, milk cartons, and juice boxes: put in the garbage.</p> <p>Any paper product coated with wax or contaminated with food please discard.</p>	<p>All plastic containers, bottles, and jugs with #1 through #7 on the bottom including items such as:</p> <p>Milk jugs, water bottles, laundry detergent, shampoo bottles, yogurt and butter tubs.</p>	<p>Styrofoam, plastic bags, food and candy wrappers, toys, non-containers.</p>  <p>Rinse out containers and throw away lids.</p>
Glass Bottles & Jars		Metal Cans	
What's Recyclable	What's NOT!	What's Recyclable	What's NOT!
<p>Recycle all glass containers bottles and jars that are clear, green or brown.</p> <p>Examples: mayonnaise jars, jam and jelly jars fruit juice jars, etc.</p> <p>Rinse & discard lids.</p>	<p>Glass containing lead such as auto glass and window glass cannot be recycled.</p> <p>No - Plates, dishes, china, drinking glasses, pottery, light bulbs, broken glass.</p>	<p>Most metal cans we use everyday are recyclable. Recycle steel, tin and aluminum cans.</p> <p>Soup cans, fruit and veggie cans, juice cans, etc. Remove labels and rinse.</p>	<p>Don't recycle aerosol cans aluminum foil, pie tins or trays.</p> <p>Throw away metal lids from glass containers.</p> 

Wearable Clothing Accepted at Transfer Stations

Each County Transfer Station is equipped with a permanent 10x12 shed for recycling used clothing and household "Bric-A-Brac" items. We accept any wearable clothing including shoes, belts, purses, coats, hats, and any usable linens, blankets, and curtains. All items need to be cleaned and bagged in plastic bags prior to coming to the transfer station.

Additional, usable household "Bric-A-Brac" items can be recycled. Items such as pots and pans, dishes, toys, stuffed animals, dolls, and nick knacks can be accepted for recycling. Items should be placed in boxes or bags.

All clothing and household items are being reused and shipped to locations in need here in the U.S., Third World Countries, and to Red Cross disaster zones.

Items NOT accepted are pillows, rags, fabric scraps, electric items, furniture, baskets and garbage.
