

# Felons

## Convicted of a Felony?

You may still have the right to vote when convicted of a Felony-Your registration is automatically cancelled; however you may be able to immediately restore your right to vote if one of the following applies to you:

- 🇺🇸 You are only serving probation
- 🇺🇸 You were not sentenced to prison or your prison sentence was suspended
- 🇺🇸 You served your MAXIMUM sentence
- 🇺🇸 You were discharged from parole
- 🇺🇸 You were pardoned

If you still have the right to vote~ you should register again with your local Board of Elections

You DO NOT have the right to vote if:

- 🇺🇸 You are currently in jail (unless you have not yet been convicted of a felony on day of election)
- 🇺🇸 You are on parole-unless granted a pardon for voting rights issued by the Governor of NY State. Your Parole officer should have information on this.
